



Policy: Section 106 Funding

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The purpose of this policy is to set out the process by which the Parish Council will handle utilisation of Section 106 funds and the eligibility and prioritisation criteria that will be applied for applications from outside bodies

### Section 106 Funding

Section 106 funds are money that developers are required to provide through the relevant planning authority, in our case Tunbridge Wells Borough Council (TWBC), as part of their development. This is governed by Section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1990. The intention is to provide resources through which the impact of developments can be mitigated or offset by contributing to improvements to community infrastructure and services. These can be provided on-site directly by the developer or through financial contributions to off-site investment by other organisations.

### Eligibility and priority of proposals

Under legislation, any S106 funding requirement must be:

- (i) necessary to make the development acceptable in planning terms;
- (ii) directly related to the development;
- (iii) fairly and reasonably related in scale and kind to the development.

These requirements are not closely defined or quantified so there is room for negotiation with both developers and Tunbridge Wells Borough Council on how they are used.

In addition to these criteria, the PC will give priority to proposals that are contained in or consistent with the Neighbourhood Plan and the earlier Parish Plan Survey. The Neighbourhood Plan will contain a costed list of community projects that are seen as priorities for the community.

Some examples of projects that might be considered are:

- improvements to road safety;
- footpaths, cycle paths and bridle ways;
- subsidies to bus services;
- recreation areas, such as children's playgrounds, open spaces and playing fields;
- improvements to community buildings and services;
- environmental projects.

### Eligibility of organisations to receive S106 funding

Although S106 funding must be used in the interests of the community, it is not restricted to projects implemented by the Parish Council. Other organisations in the private or public sector are eligible, and need not be based in the parish, so long as the benefits will wholly accrue to our community. A formal agreement will be required with any beneficiary organisation to ensure that community benefits are safeguarded, usually in perpetuity.

Beneficiary organisations must be properly constituted, with a bank account and auditable accounts.

### Procedures



## BRENCHLEY AND MATFIELD PARISH COUNCIL



All applications for Section 106 funded projects must be made via the Parish Council. An application form is annexed to this policy statement. Organisations wishing to benefit from Section 106 funding may put forward proposals at any time. If the Council decides that such proposals are a priority, they will be added to the bank of potential projects.

As and when developments are proposed that would entail Section 106 contributions, the Council will consider how best such contributions might be used. Section 106 utilisation is subject to the approval of TWBC as well as negotiation with the developer. The new Local Plan and Neighbourhood Plan will identify Section 106 priorities for each Local Plan site allocation, hence it is important to develop ideas into costed projects as soon as possible and identify links with particular sites. Work on this is currently being led by the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group as part of work on the Neighbourhood Plan.

Alternative arrangements for developing and recommending projects to the Council will be confirmed once the work of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has been completed.

Receipt of funds from the developer after completion of the project will be made via the Parish Council and passed on to the applicant. The applicant must comply with any requirement deemed necessary by the PC or TWBC in order to assess use of funds.

Approval of a project by the Parish Council does not indicate acceptance by TWBC and will be subject to the terms of the relevant developer contribution agreement.
